


Religious Education at Homewood Friends Meeting









RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR ALL AGES

September is the start of a new year for children and adult Religious Education at Homewood Friends Meeting.

Why did we switch from PayPal to Breeze?

There are many reasons we made the switch to Breeze. Breeze is a company that manages online donations for thousands of organizations, including several other Friends meetings in Baltimore Yearly Meeting, and has lower fees than PayPal. It takes fewer steps for our office to process gifts through Breeze than PayPal. Like PayPal, Breeze's donation form is encrypted to protect your

personal information. And Breeze has additional database services, which are beneficial for the Meeting.

What is ACH and why should I give that way?

ACH is like an e-check. The amount is directly withdrawn from your bank account instead of charged to a credit card.

ACH has the lowest fees for online giving and is the easiest gift for us to process. It is recommended by our auditors as the most secure method of giving, and as an electronic method of money transfer, it is eco-friendly.

Can I still give by credit/debit card?

Yes! Breeze works just like PayPal or any other online giving form with a credit/debit card. The fee for Homewood to process gifts this way is just slightly higher than with ACH, but it is just as eco-friendly.

Why not give by auto-generated check?

This is still an option. However, when you give by auto-generated check through your bank, an actual check is created and mailed to our office. This uses more resources – paper for checks and deposit slips and energy to mail the checks and then drive to the bank to deposit checks; we have had trouble with USPS delays (sometimes months late); and paper checks are more time consuming for our staff to process.

Can I still give by paper check?

This is still an option, particularly if this is the most comfortable way for you to make a gift. If you prefer to give this way, please make your check payable to "Homewood Friends Meeting."

Thinking About Race - (September 2022) Tears We Cannot Stop

This month's column, which quotes a passage from the book by Michael Eric Dyson, <u>Tears We Cannot Stop: A Sermon To White America</u> (2017), was contributed by Tronette Anochie of Sandy Spring Friends meeting who also provided a response.

"America is in trouble, and a lot of that trouble - perhaps most of it - has to do with race. Everywhere we turn, there is discord and division, death and destruction. When we survey the land, we see a country full of suffering that we cannot fully understand, and a history that we can no longer deny. Slavery casts a long shadow across our lives. The spoils we reaped from forcing people to work without wages and treating them with grievous inhumanity continue to haunt us in a racial gulf that seems impossible to overcome. Black and white people don't merely have different experiences; we seem to occupy different universes, with worldviews that are fatally opposed to one another."

Response: Where do we go from here? The BYM Working Group on Racism, the Growing Diverse Leadership Committee, the Reparations Action Committee, and STRIDE are seeking the way forward out of darkness. But everyone is needed as we move towards the Light. A Friend who

likes simple prayers asks, "What is mine to do?" Each person should be asking themselves this question and then listening to the Spirit within for direction, guidance, love, and action.

Achieving Zero Waste at the Meetinghouse and Home Beginning in September, the Green Organizing Action Team (GOAT) will be focused on the goal of "Achieving Zero Waste at the Meetinghouse and Home". Needless to say this is an ambitious goal. And also we acknowledge that what we are doing and will do, is like a tiny pebble thrown into the ocean. However, our faith guides and requires of us to do all that we can to care for the earth.
