MINISTRY & COUNSEL: The Baltimore Yearly Meeting Faith and Practice Committee has requested input from Monthly Meetings on proposed revisions to our <u>Faith & Practice</u>. As you may remember, <u>Faith and Practice</u> includes advice regarding procedures within the faith, membership, current practice for conducting meeting business, as well as numerous quotations from Friends on belief, worship, concerns, leadings, and testimonies. The BYM Faith and Practice Committee is currently focusing on the *Life of the Spirit* section of the current <u>Faith & Practice</u> (1988 rev through 2021).

Right now the Committee is looking for feedback on two proposed sections: *The Quaker Experience* and *Meeting for Worship.* These two sections would replace three sections in the current <u>Faith & Practice</u>: 1) *Cultivation of the Life of the Spirit*, 2) *Meeting for Worship*, and 3) *Vocal Ministry*. Both sessions will be hybrid. The in-person sessions will be held in the meeting room.

The BYM Faith and Practice Committee asks that the Meeting consider the proposed replacements and share their sense of whether inclusion in <u>Faith & Practice</u> will make it a better document. They also welcome any suggestions for improvements. We will use the following queries provided by BYM's Faith and Practice Committee to guide the worship sharing.

- What resonates for you in this text?
- What if anything causes resistance?
- What challenges you?
- What suggestions do you have for improving the document?

Ministry and Counsel will record the responses from both sessions and share them with BYM's Faith and Practice Committee by March 1, 2023 so that they can reflect on the responses, revise as necessary, and produce a document for first reading for the June 2023 interim meeting. Ministry and Counsel will also make the responses available to Homewood Meeting.

WORKING FOR CHANGE: Even though Homewood's Change Group has been laid down for now, important work continues to support Homewood's approved commitment to anti-racism.

Homewood is a member of the local **Black Lives Matter Interfaith Coalition** (<u>BLMIC.org</u>). The website advertises rallies which are multi-congregational, multiracial, and interfaith. They provide an opportunity for Homewood members and the Meeting to build relationships.

On Sunday, **January 15**, in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Baltimore Hebrew Congregation is partnering with other congregations and organizations in the Baltimore area for its 6th annual movie screening, panel, and talkback. This year's event will feature the film **"On These Grounds,"** an award-winning documentary that explores the school-to-prison pipeline by focusing on an explosive video of a white school resource officer in South Carolina throwing a Black teenager from her school desk. The movie explores what role race played in the incident, examining the disparate media coverage of the incident and the origins of criminalizing children's

Thinking About Race - (January 2023) —"Ladder to the Light"

Ladder to the Light -- An Indigenous Elder's Meditations on Hope and Courage, by Steven Charleston, member of the Choctaw Nation. 2021, Broadleaf Books, p. 79

"One of the greatest challenges we face in our ascent to freedom is the fear of diversity. Throughout the centuries, oppressive cultures have invented scores of ways to pretend human beings are fundamentally different. They have invented the concept of race. They have developed elaborate caste systems. They have engineered class distinctions. They have economically separated people by gender. They have practiced religious exclusivity and intolerance. The list goes on, but the results have been the same. Humanity has remained fractured along imaginary fault lines created by fear and perpetuated for social control and domination."

Steven goes on to tell us how to climb the ladder: "In the kiva, we begin overcoming this fear. We begin to see the deeper truth of our own humanity. The higher we climb on the ladder, the more we realize the reality of our own existence. We are not different; we are the same. The light exposes these false divisions and helps us recognize one another for what we are: brothers and sisters in the great tribe of the human beings."

<u>FMW</u>: Friends Meeting of Washington has invited F/friends from throughout BYM to participate in this virtual learning opportunity. <u>Listening to the Heart of Genesis – A Contemplative Path – with Rabbi Leila Gal Berner, Ph.D.</u>

Basing her new Jewish practice on a Christian medieval contemplative practice, *lectio divina*, Rabbi Leila Gal Berner has developed *kriat hakodesh*, reading the sacred, in which we listen to a biblical text in deep contemplation and then enter into silence, after having been asked personal questions which pertain to the text and to our own lives. It is a powerful experience in which we enter into a new gateway to the Bible connecting it to our own life experience. The biblical matriarchs and patriarchs become US as we feel the commonalities between their lives and our own.

Rabbi Leila will offer five sessions of *kriat hakodesh* by Zoom from **February 3rd** through **March 3rd**, 2023. The sessions will be on **Friday mornings from 10 to 11:20 AM**. The five sessions are enriched through deep listening, silence, chanting and sharing. The stories of Genesis come alive for us in new ways.

Friends must commit to stay with the group for all five sessions. \$125 per participant. A minimum of eight participants is needed.
