Food Aid: Viva House, a Catholic Worker House that Homewood has long supported, is requesting food bags for their West Baltimore community. Bags consist of EXACTLY:

- 1 reusable grocery bag (to pack the food in)
- 1 box Cheerios
- 1 jar peanut butter
- 1 jar jelly or jam
- 1 box spaghetti
- 1 can vegetables (collards are a favorite)
- 1- can soup
- 3 cans meat (chicken, chili or such)
- 2 boxes macaroni & cheese
- 2 rolls toilet paper

Bring to the meeting house (little kitchen on landing going downstairs) by 12/9.

Each of us moves through the world damaging others with our sharp edges. Often we hurt others by accident. Sometimes we do so on purpose. But none of us is so virtuous or so careful as to make it through this world without leaving wounds in our wake. We have withdrawn from those who had a right to expect our emotional engagement. We have imposed on those who had a right to expect our restraint. We have abandoned those who had a right to nurture, and we have oppressed and abused those who had a right to freedom. To own the reality of that, to sit with its impact, without minimizing, denying or justifying it to ourselves – that is a work that takes courage and the willingness to sit with painful truths.
