Yohannes Woldermariam is originally from Eritrea (then part of Ethiopia). He was a refugee in Sudan fleeing political violence from where he was resettled to the USA where he became a citizen. He received a doctorate in International Relations from the U of Mass, Amherst. He then taught at Fort Lewis College and at Univ of Colorado. During the COVID epidemic, he came to Baltimore and has been a part of Homewood Peace and Social Justice committee off and on over 4-5 years. He was hired by EPA about six months ago. But under Trump/Musk cuts he was let go. He became homeless, sleeping under a bridge for 5 nights last week. A colleague/friend is giving him temporary lodging at present (a couple weeks). But he seeks to rent a room in someone's house until he can reestablish himself. He has disability income but no other income yet. He has friends who will assist with his rent and he receives food stamps and can afford up to \$500 to \$600/mo. for rent. He needs a place where he doesn't have to commit to a lease as he is likely to move if and when a job becomes available again.
