**Homewood Garden News** The gardening season is underway at Homewood with work-mornings held on 4/5 and 4/19. In that two-week period, the garden, with the help of organic materials, has transformed from a late winter landscape to a vibrant spring space. We planted honeysuckle, Jacob's Ladder, and ferns to fill out a section of the garden.

The garden work-mornings are wonderful opportunities to slow down and take notice of all that is happening around us. For example, at the 4/19 work morning, we investigated the north-facing wall of our building. That is the one that is adjacent to Hillel. Not many people go there! But the shady and somewhat cooler space is home to a robust stand of hydrangea. We took some of the winter stems and grasses to serve as mulch. We are eager to track the growth of the hydrangea. Come join us! Look for a notice of our next work morning in the garden in early May.

**The 2025 Maryland General Assembly** adjourned at midnight on April 7<sup>th</sup>. Only a month earlier, environmentalists were bracing for a session with very few positive outcomes. However, advocates continued to work hard to improve and pass several pieces of legislation.

While the Bottle Bill made progress and passed one panel in the House of Delegates, it did not have sufficient support to Cross Over to the Senate. Advocates are already considering how a new campaign might be developed for the General Assembly in winter 2026.

The Chesapeake Climate Action Network has created a legislative recap briefly describing several pieces of environmental legislation and the outcomes – Victories, Unfortunate Losses, and Bills they might retry in 2026. CCAN noted those bills that were most improved.
