From the Flushing Remonstrance, 1657

"...Yet when death and the Law assaults us: if we have our advocate to seek who shall plead for us in this case of Conscience betwixt god and our own souls the powers of this world can neither attack us neither excuse us for if god justify who can Condemn and if god Condemn, there is none can justify and for those Jealousies and suspicions which some have of them that they are destructive unto Magistracy and Ministery that cannot be: for the Magistrate hath the Sword in his hand and the Minister hath the Sword in his hand as witness those two great examples which all Magistrates and Ministers are to follow: Moses and Christ whom god raised up."
