Garden Up Date On Saturday June 28th, 7 people from Homewood's Garden Club worked in the garden for a total of 7 hours. The garden is prolific and so most of the collective labor focused on weeding out grasses. Wild flowers are abundant and so there is no shortage of small, lovely vistas within the garden. Within about an hour and a half, we went from an unruly native plants garden to a gently cared for garden that wears its native-ness well. The fig and apple trees are very healthy. We can look forward to harvesting some nice fruit later this summer and early autumn.

Homewood's garden received a lovely tribute in June from a Hopkins student who was walking through from St. Paul to North Charles. I was doing some weeding on the brick walkway and she waved at me. In a brief chat, she told me that she was a semester away from graduating and that she felt the garden was instrumental in helping her deal with the stresses of college life. She related how the garden has been a refuge, a safe spot where she can go and just be. It was moving to hear about a slice of her life that has meant so much to her.
