From the BYM Advices

1. Conduct of Business

[...] Meetings for business are held in a spirit of worship. This does not mean they must be overly solemn or devoid of humor. It means they should be conducted in a spirit of inward recollection out of which will come a flexible and informal dignity fitting to the conduct of the work of a Religious Society.

Friends believe that the right and satisfactory decision in any matter is reached when those present understand and consent in the proposed judgment, finding it in accordance with their understanding of the will of God for the Meeting's action. Therefore, they act on a basis of the "sense of the Meeting" rather than by decision of the majority [...]

SPIRITUAL STATE OF THE MEETING

SPECIAL WORSHIP TIME ON 2/22

Every year, Baltimore Yearly Meeting (BYM) asks all monthly meetings to submit a report on the meeting's spiritual state. These reports are later shared in BYM committee meetings and publications. To guide this annual process, the BYM Ministry and Pastoral Care Committee proffered queries which the Ministry and Counsel Committee (M&C) of Homewood Friends Meeting reviewed and revised. The queries to be discussed are listed below.

On February 22nd, as part of an extended Meeting for Worship ending at noon, there will be group worship-sharing to consider the three queries. Attendees' responses will be recorded by three seasoned Friends. The responses together with observations recorded by M&C members throughout the year will be distilled into a draft report by M&C that hopefully accurately captures the spiritual state of our meeting. It will come to Business Meeting for discussion and possible revision.

A special lunch will follow the worship-sharing session.

Queries for our Spiritual State of the Meeting Report

1. What do we mean by "Spirit" and how do we live together faithfully amid our different understandings of it?
2. Are our lives- individually and as a Meeting- truly aligned with what we say we believe?
3. Are we listening and responding to Spirit together in ways that nurture one another and lead us into loving action?

Electrifying our Homes

Wednesday February 11, 7 pm at the Meetinghouse

Join us for this workshop on electrifying our homes. This session will cover strategies for electrification, focusing on building shell improvements and equipment, including HVAC, water heaters, stoves, and solar options. Incentives for market rate customers and programs for low-income households will also be discussed.

Thom Price is a Home Energy Auditor who has been helping people make their houses more comfortable, efficient, and green for 15 years, mostly within the Weatherization Assistance Program and more recently with EmPOWER MD. In the previous administration he was a Building Technologies Engineer with the US Dept. of Energy, working on decarbonization projects.

Andrea Judson is a resident of the Remington neighborhood. Andrea will share her experience of going all electric last summer, including answering questions about cost, logistics, and everything in between.

Drawing inspiration from the "Death Café" concept, a "Climate Café" is a space focused specifically on ecological grief. The grief may be prompted by climate disruption, loss of ecosystems and species, or fear of a deadly future, if not for us, for our neighbors and descendants. Tara Reilly, who brought Death Cafés to Homewood Meeting in the past year, will facilitate the Climate Café. There is free-flowing conversation for an hour and we conclude with coffee, tea, and cake.
